(All Classes 1–61(Y) Applies to the age of the cavy on the day of the show.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING IMPORTANT CHANGES

The new trial INTERMEDIATE SECTION, applies ONLY to NSWCC Shows and NOT to CCCC Shows. It is a 6 month trial run for NSWCC shows commencing the beginning of 2014 for cavies aged 9 months to under 12 months (This will mean that Adult Boars and Sows must be aged 12 months on the day of the show). This trial will be evaluated/discussed mid-year to see if it will continue permanently. NSWCC members: watch *Cavy Capers* for details on discussion/voting of this issue.

NSWCC Shows ONLY:

- **A** **Boar** (12 mo and over)
- **B** **Sow** (12 mo and over)
- **T** (for Trial) **Intermediate** (9 mo to under 12 mo)
- **C** **Junior** (6 mo to under 9 mo)
- **D** **Baby** (3 mo to under 6 mo)

CCCC Shows ONLY:

- **A** **Boar** (9 mo and over)
- **B** **Sow** (9 mo and over)
- **C** **Junior** (6 mo to under 9 mo)
- **D** **Baby** (3 mo to under 6 mo)

THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO BOTH NSWCC & CCCC

NOVICE EXHIBITORS (Class 54)

Cavies do NOT need to have a pedigree or conform to any breed standard to be eligible for the Novice Class. They may be of pet quality. The Novice Class is for members of an ANCC sanctioned club in their first year of showing/membership. Cavies entered must be exhibited, owned and prepared by the Novice member. Entries/scratchings must be confirmed/collected by 9.00 am. **CCCC: Judging of OTHER CLASSES 53 – 61(Y) at 9.30 am.**

UNSTANDARDISED (Class 52)

This class is for new breeds that have been granted a 'Working Title' by the ANCC Standards Review Panel, but do not have a recognised standard. They are presented to the judges for discussion and are not judged. No awards are given. There is no entry fee for these breeds.

PAYMENT

On the day at the show. Get your ear tags when you pay. Cost is \$5 for the first animal/Class; and \$1.50 per animal/Class for the remainder.

ENTRY FORM

Date of Birth, Sex and breed details must be stated for every animal †EXCEPT with COARSE COAT and LONGHAIR breeds (give breed only; NOT colour).

Any animal without DOB will be placed in the Adult Section. This may negatively impact on the judging of your animal. Changing the Cavy's Section is not to be done at the judging table.

Please give ALL required details on your entry form. Your cooperation is necessary in order for the Entries Secretary to ensure the judging paperwork is accurate; and for the smooth running of the show.

EXHIBITION

Exhibitors must be financial members of an ANCC affiliated cavy club. **Carpet squares** approximately 30cm X 30cm are required for each cavy; or **show boards**, to be no higher than 5cm.

JUDGING

The judge's decision is FINAL and no correspondence will be entered into.

No judge or the immediate family of a judge may exhibit at a show at which they are judging General Classes. A cavy purchased from a judge may not be exhibited under that judge until a period of 3 months has elapsed. No talking is permitted at the judging table. Any communications must be left until after the judging of that class has concluded. Any exhibitor making comments about other animals may risk their animal being disqualified.

TRESTLE TABLES

There are a limited number of tables and chairs at most halls. If you have your own you may want to bring them.

SELLING OF CAVIES AT SHOWS

Members of either Club may sell cavies at shows. Please have boxes for travelling to new homes; samples of the usual food; basic cavy care instructions and diet information (of your own design or give the Club produced booklet: *Basic Cavy Care*. Valued at \$2, this booklet is available to members for 50 cents each.)

Make sure to give your contact details, as well as the sex, DOB and breed of the cavies for sale. Indicate whether or not they are showable animals. Cavies for sale may not be heavily pregnant; or under 4 weeks of age without their mother. All babies for sale should be properly weaned and eating independently. All cavies for sale must be in good health, free from parasites and of a good size for age.

Spot checks will be carried out on sale animals to check for lice, mites or fungal problems and for under sized/underage or pregnant animals. First offence will require the seller to remove the animals from sale with a warning and a second offence means they will not be allowed to sell cavies at a show in the future.

The **minimum selling price for cavies at shows** is \$30. At CCCC shows, sellers are limited to a maximum of 10 cavies for sale.

JUDGING OF OTHER CLASSES

judging of OTHER CLASSES (Members' Pets; Novice; Junior and Young Exhibitors) at 9.30 am. Entries/scratchings must be confirmed/collected by 9.00 am.

JUNIOR EXHIBITORS (Classes 55 – 61)

Cavies must be exhibited and prepared by an **under 18 member** of an ANCC sanctioned club. **THE CAVY MUST ALSO BE ENTERED IN THE CORRESPONDING GENERAL CLASS.**

YOUNG EXHIBITORS (Classes 55Y – 61Y)

Cavies must be exhibited and prepared by an **under 10 member** of an ANCC sanctioned club. Members under the age of 10 are expected to help groom and bathe their entry and exhibit the cavy. The judge may question them on what they did to prepare their entry. **THE CAVY MUST ALSO BE ENTERED IN THE CORRESPONDING GENERAL CLASS.**

MEMBERS' PET CLASS (Class 53)

& Public Pet Show (CCCC only)

Club Members are ineligible to enter the public Pet Show except the Fancy Dress and Fastest Eater Classes. A cavy that is being shown in its Breed Class is not eligible to be shown in the Members' Pet Class at the same show. Definition of a Pet is a cavy that is not being show in the Breed Class.

ENTRIES (CCCC, QUEANBEYAN)

May be **emailed, faxed or posted**. No phone entries can be accepted. Use the entry form in this document (or you may use a facsimiles for email). LATE ENTRIES (CCCC)

Taken on the day at double the rate; after the first \$5.00.

HALL OPENS (QUEANBEYAN)

9 am. Entries/scratchings must be confirmed/collected before 9.30 am, with Judging at 10 am. **'Other Classes 53 – 61(Y)' are judged at 9.30.** Please organise entries/scratchings for these classes before 9.15.

CARRY CAGE BEDDING (CCCC)

Exhibitors are asked to try to minimise mess and protect carpet by using recycled-newspaper-type bedding in carry cages; and NOT shavings, hay or rice hulls. CCCC recommends the use of **Back-2-Nature small animal bedding & litter** for guinea pigs and is generously sponsored by **FibreCycle™** www.fibrecycle.com.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up their own area before leaving. A dust pan and brush are available from the Admin Table.
